Uxbridge College

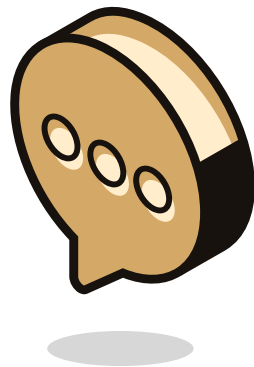

STUDENT SUPPORT



Induction:

Establishing a community is important to us at HRUC and we take great care with providing support for our international students to better help learners integrate into the London study scene. We host an International Students Induction Session at our Uxbridge Campus, where learners can meet their fellow international students, make friends and become better acquainted with the College. This event includes food, drinks, games, important talks from the international team, a welcome from the College Principals, a tour of the campus and town centre.

Equality and Diversity:

We extend a warm welcome to everyone, regardless of background or starting point, and are fully committed to promoting, maintaining and supporting equality of opportunity and inclusivity in all aspects of our work.

Student Safety:

The safety and wellbeing of our students and staff is of utmost importance to us. We have a Safeguarding Team across all college campuses to help you keep safe and secure. Our weekly tutorial sessions deliver a range of topics to our students to help academic and personal development.

Impartial Careers Advice:

Our team of expert careers advisors enable students to access opportunities in both work and education. They offer individual sessions when needed and impartial careers advice to help students plan their next steps.



Pastoral Care:

Study Skills:

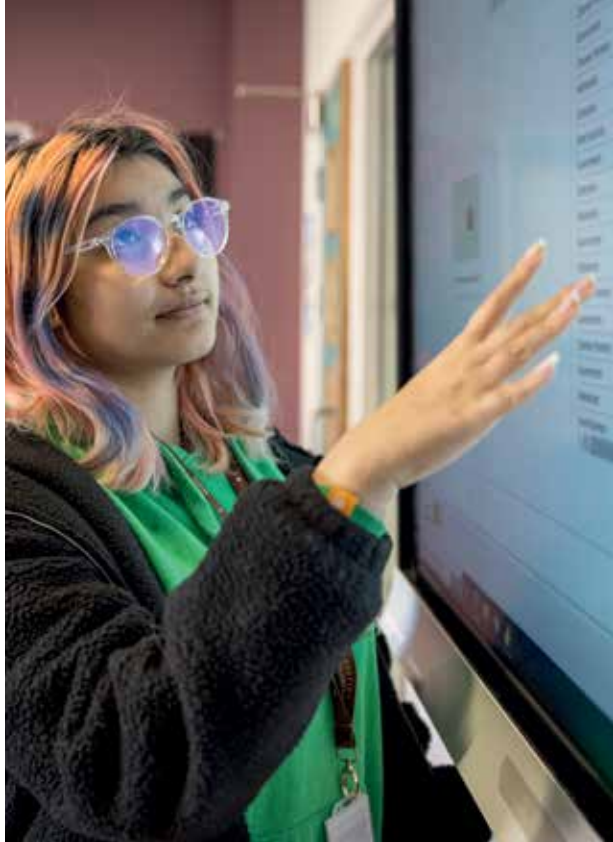

HRUC has developed an International Student Internship Programme. Students have the opportunity to work alongside local businesses in London, gaining hands on experience applying practical skills to a working environment, enabling our students to develop their professional skills.

HRUC provides opportunities for students to participate in class and extra-curricular activities including volunteering, enrichment and employability programmes which enhance communication and social skills, plus boost CV (Curriculum Vitae) and career opportunities.



FANTASTIC FACILITIES



West London Institute of Technology (WLIoT) :

Our college group is home to the West London Institute of Technology with the flagship building on our Uxbridge Campus. In partnership with Brunel University London and Heathrow Airport, the Institute provides students with innovative Higher Technical qualifications and facilities.

Higher Education Learning Resource Hub:

Study a HNC/HND programme with us and you will have full access to the dedicated WLIoT (West London Institute of Technology) Learning Resources Hub. With modern high-tech facilities, it is the perfect place to study and relax.

Study in a Top-Class Environment:

At HRUC, we use the latest technology including smartboards, PCs, Macs, iPads, and Chromebooks. We have continually invested in our campuses, updating and improving our classrooms, specialist facilities and social spaces. Our vocational courses are taught in industry-standard facilities to give you an experience of the 'real' working environment.

Mock Airline Cabin:

Uxbridge College has a mock airline cabin where our Travel & Tourism students can work in the interior of an airplane, developing their familiarity and experience with the aviation industry.

The Enterprise Centre at Harrow on the Hill:

The Enterprise Centre provides a mixture of classrooms and flexible workspaces across four floors. There is also a fantastic employability hub for recruitment, careers and work placement services.

Music Studios:

Richmond upon Thames College's Music Department has industry-standard facilities, including Logic, Ableton, Native Instruments and Waves software. There are superbly equipped rehearsal rooms and mixdown/programming suites, as well as a state-of-the-art main recording studio.

Engineering:

Our engineering facilities boast state-of-the-art technology such as:

- ▶ Fully equipped electrical labs, including a spectrum analyser
- ▶ Digital storage oscilloscopes
- ▶ Process control and PCB manufacturing
- ▶ Milling machines
- ▶ TIG welding
- ▶ Gas turbine engine and a wind tunnel
- ▶ Software including AutoCAD, Automation Studio, Solid Works, Matlab, and Inventor.

This ensures that our students are familiar with the machinery that they will be required to use when entering their chosen field of work.



FANTASTIC FACILITIES



Seacole Building for Health & Social Care:

Launched on 10 July 2018, Harrow Weald's Seacole Building features a domestic care suite. Students can learn how to look after vulnerable adults in a home setting. In our orthopaedic care suite, students gain experience of handling clients getting in/out of hospital beds and learning how to operate them. Facilities also include a nutrition laboratory, exercise suite and a triage room, for learning how to assess the needs of vulnerable clients in emergency situations.

Learning Resources Centres:

Gain access to our full library services including books, e-books, an extensive range of online resources, DVDs, newspapers, journals, trade publications and audio-visual media. Based on all campuses, our LRCs (Learning Resource Centres) provide separate areas for silent individual study, group study, as well as excellent IT suites with up-to-date computing facilities and hundreds of laptops for student use. You can attend study skills sessions through the LRC to enhance your skills including using Google skills and Harvard referencing.

E-Learning:

All students have access to online productivity tools and unlimited cloud storage, as well as 24/7 access to timetables, targets and social groups. Our 500 plus free access PCs are available for use around all campuses, supported by our Digital Specialists. There are also bookable iPads and Chromebooks to help with your studies and gain confidence in using technology to enhance your learning. There is also free student Wi-Fi.

The Exchange and the Mall at Uxbridge Campus:

Catch up with your friends, eat breakfast or lunch together, grab a quick snack or drink from Starbucks, relax between lessons and find out the latest College information from the TV screens at The Exchange. Head to The Mall's social spaces, play a board game, have a coffee, or simply enjoy space to unwind.

The Pavilion, The Student Lounge and Golden Park at Hayes Campus

With plenty of seating, The Pavilion is ideal for eating, socialising or relaxing. Situated by The Pavilion, The Student Lounge is ideal to unwind between lessons, catch up with friends, play games and watch TV. You can also enjoy the outdoors, with a game of table tennis in The Quad or relax in Golden Park, which features an outdoor gym, basketball courts plus an open-air theatre space for performances.

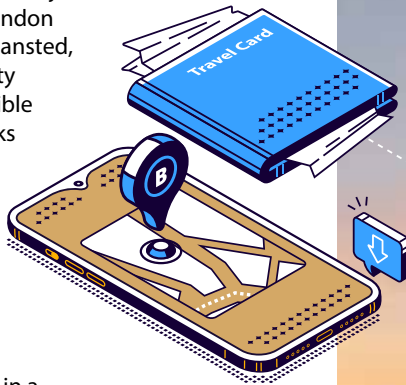
Airports

HRUC has good links with all London airports. Our campuses are easily accessible via major routes and close to London Heathrow, Gatwick, Stansted, Luton, and London City Airports are all accessible via high-speed rail links from London.

Free Bus Travel and Discounted Train Travel

Full-time students aged 16-18 and living in a London borough can apply for a 16+ Zip Oyster photocard giving them free travel on buses and discount travel on the Tube. Full-time students aged 19 and over can apply for an 18+ Student Oyster photocard providing 30% discount on travel cards and bus season tickets.

CAMPUS LOCATION



Uxbridge Campus

Uxbridge is our largest campus and is located in west London. Its great transport links mean that you can be in the centre of London in under an hour. The Uxbridge Campus is just minutes from Uxbridge town centre, which boasts a large number of stores, a nine-screen cinema, and a variety of places to eat and drink.

Uxbridge has two main shopping malls – The Chimes and The Pavilions. Both of these shopping centres have a great range of popular brand and independent stores. Pavement cafes, coffee shops filled with comfy sofas, traditional and modern pubs and bars make Uxbridge a great place to relax and socialise with friends.

Uxbridge College is easily accessible by public transport. The campus is just a short distance from Uxbridge Tube Station and on more than a dozen bus routes.



Hayes Campus

Hayes Campus is part of a complex which includes a health centre, a recreation ground, housing and a day centre for the elderly. It is a few yards from the Uxbridge Road – one of the area's major transport routes and is close to Hayes & Harlington Station. It is in the heart of west London's multicultural community.

Hayes Campus is well placed for access by bus. It is less than two miles from Hayes & Harlington train station, which offers direct access into central London via the new Elizabeth Line.



Harrow on the Hill Campus

This campus is just 10 miles from central London attractions and entertainment. Harrow College is close to the famous Wembley Stadium and has a wide variety of activities you can fill your time with. There are two major shopping centres and a wide variety of shops to suit different tastes as well as restaurants, fast food outlets and a large cinema. There are many parks, gyms and a large leisure centre – so there are plenty of options for sporting types. Harrow on the Hill has excellent transport links. The station is only a three-minute walk away and is linked to the Metropolitan line, easily within reach of Baker Street and King's Cross stations. Harrow bus station is nearby.



Harrow Weald Campus

This campus has enjoyed a number of recent redevelopment projects, including a brand new Health & Social Care (Seacole) building. This amazing facility includes a domestic care suite, orthopaedic care suite, nutrition laboratory, exercise suite, triage room and IT facilities to support learning and development. A dedicated centre for Art & Design is also located here.

Harrow Weald Campus has good transport links with multiple bus routes within walking distance. It is also served by Harrow and Wealdstone station (Bakerloo line and national rail to Euston), which is a short bus journey away.



Richmond upon Thames Campus

Richmond upon Thames College is in the process of a major £80m flagship development with phase 1 already complete, showcasing a redeveloped campus. Twickenham Station is a short walk from the college campus with links into London via the South Western railway and has multiple bus routes. The College is based near Twickenham Stadium and the World Rugby Museum, as well as being situated by local amenities.

Our brand new future technology-focused STEM Centre (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) provides a state-of-the-art environment for training in engineering and construction, science, forensic sciences, computing and robotics.



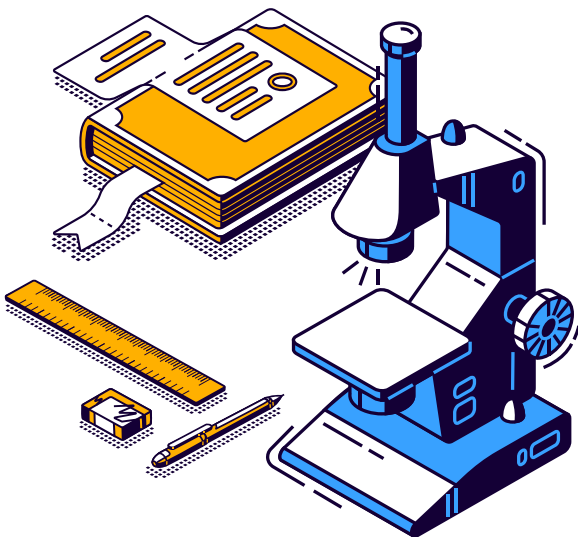
COURSES

Pre-University Programmes

Our pre-university programmes are designed to enable students to progress onto the first year of a Bachelor's degree. Students can study a vocational Level 3 qualification, A Levels or Foundation Access course.

Vocational Level 3 Qualifications - Pearson BTEC/UAL

Our vocational courses are planned with your future career in mind so you will learn the things you really need to help you go from college straight into work or university. Lectures focus on the practical things you need to know, and the behind-the-scenes knowledge required for the workplace. You can also go on to develop your vocational skills with a degree course at college or university. Last year 91% of our BTEC/UAL students progressed onto a university/ Higher Education course.

HRUC is one of only 21 institutions in the UK confirmed as an Institute of Technology (IoT).

The government has established IoTs, which are collaborations between further education (FE) providers, universities, and employers. A Levels - The Gold Standard

An A Level programme is the UK's gold standard for university entry and will help you achieve the grades you need to apply for the UK's leading universities including Oxford and Cambridge.

A Levels are recognised all over the globe and achieving good grades will ensure you get to choose from the world's most pre-eminent universities. Last year, our students achieved a 99% A Level pass rate.

A Levels are studied over two years. Most students study three subjects and the final assessment is based on end-of-course exams which determine your grasp of the subject as a whole. The A Level model offers flexibility to students and will give you the chance to study what you want in great depth. A Levels are studied at both our Uxbridge and Richmond campuses.

ACCOMMODATION



It is essential that you have arranged accommodation in the UK before starting your course at HRUC.

We can provide information on local letting agencies and student accommodation in London that specialise in lettings for international students. This information can also be found in the accommodation booklet that is provided to students on our website.

You must provide evidence that you will be living within a reasonable distance to college. We recommend that the travel time between your home and college is not more than one hour.

Alternatively, if you and your parents would prefer that you did not live on your own (this is especially common with younger students) we would invite you to contact our partner Homestay providers.

Our providers are leading accommodation agencies in London and can help students find a suitable host family. This can also benefit you in terms of learning more about British culture and practising English language skills in a safe family environment.

We have also established a new link with University of West London giving you access to multiple accommodation options with excellent transport links to HRUC campuses.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To apply to study at HRUC you will be required to obtain a Student Visa or Short-Term Study Visa. You must choose a course that fulfils the following criteria:

- ▶ The course is listed in the Courses section of this guide
- ▶ You must be at least 16 years of age on 31st August, in the year in which you enrol as a student
- ▶ If you are under the age of 18 you must be able to provide written consent from your parent/guardian that you are allowed to study in the UK.

Making an Initial Enquiry

We will advise you of course options and decide if we can offer you a suitable course, based on your interests, motives and qualifications. Alternatively, you can get advice from one of our in-country educational agencies. Please contact our International Office for a list of verified agents.



We also accept nationally awarded vocational qualifications in addition to the qualifications listed opposite.

Entry Requirements

Details of the entry requirements for each individual course can be found on the college websites. The International Office can also provide country-specific guidance for the area you have applied from if you are unsure about the level of your qualifications. Generally, you will need to have completed schooling up to age 16. All certificates submitted will be compared to UK qualifications using UK ENIC. We consider qualifications such as:

Botswana – General Certificate of Secondary Education

Caribbean - Caribbean Examinations Council Secondary Education Certificate

China - Senior Secondary School Graduation

GCSEs/IGCSEs/Cambridge O-Levels

India - Certificate of Secondary Education (Class-X) / All India Secondary School Examination (CBSE) / Standard 12 (State Boards)

International Baccalaureate

Iran - High School Diploma

Kenya - Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE)

South Africa - National Senior Certificate

Uganda - Uganda Certificate of Education (UCE)

USA - High School Diploma

Uzbekistan- Certificate of General Secondary Education (Grade XI)

Vietnam- Senior Secondary School Graduation Diploma

West Africa - Senior School Certificate (WASSCE)

Zimbabwe - General Certificate of Education at Ordinary Level.

English Language

HRUC requires all its students to have a good level of English. Most of the applicants for our courses will be nationals of a country whose first language is not English. You may need to provide evidence of a UKVI (UK Visas and Immigration) recognised Secure English Language Test for the purpose of your visa application. A minimum of CEFR B2 grade in all bands is required for entry onto our courses.

If you do not have the sufficient level of English for your chosen course and are under the age of 19, HRUC is able to provide an intensive English programme to ensure that you can progress onto a Level 3 course in the following academic session.



Making an Application

Applications from international students can be submitted via the Uxbridge College, Harrow College, and Richmond College websites, directly to the International Office or through our recognised agencies. You will then be asked to submit supporting documents. Once received, the completed application is then assessed by the International Office. The application packs should include:

- ▶ A completed application form
- ▶ A completed application form supplement
- ▶ Copies of all qualification certificates and transcripts
- ▶ Proof of an UKVI Secure English Language Test (SELT) result
- ▶ CV/Reference
- ▶ A copy of your passport photograph page.

It is essential that most documents are submitted as this enables us to make an offer quickly.



Video Interview

Once the application pack has been received by the International Office, you will be requested to participate in a video interview (MS Teams) with the International Office and a member of academic staff. Guidance as to what your interview will entail will be communicated to you before your interview date. Ensure that you are prepared for the interview and have done your research into HRUC and the course you wish to study, as we cannot progress applications further if we do not believe you to be a genuine student.

Students applying from inside the UK will be invited in for a face-to-face interview at one of the HRUC campuses.



Conditional Offer

One of three things will happen after video interview:

1) A Conditional Offer letter will be issued

A Conditional Offer letter will be issued if the application pack is complete. The offer letter is usually conditional on final year exam results or any upcoming SELT exam. If an offer letter is issued, this will be emailed directly to you or your agent. An email acknowledging you have read the Terms and Conditions is required by our International Office.

The offer letter will confirm:

- ▶ The course that you have been made an offer for
- ▶ Conditions that you must fulfil to confirm your place
- ▶ Next steps you need to take to receive the CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies)
- ▶ UKVI requirement for finances to prove you have sufficient funds to cover living costs in the UK.

2) Request for further information

If there is more than one document missing then a request for the missing documents will be made before any action is taken. Also, if there are any discrepancies, the application will remain undecided until these have been rectified.

3) Rejection

If you are not appropriate for the chosen course and no alternative can be given then HRUC reserves the right to reject your application. A rejection may also occur following the mandatory video interview, even if you have met the academic criteria.

Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS)

The Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS) will be issued to you once you have paid the deposit of fees to HRUC (details of the fees can be found in the offer letter) and provided evidence of your finances. The CAS is required to make a Student Visa application with UK Visas and Immigration. Intensive English language students applying for a Short-Term Study Visa will be issued with an Unconditional Offer letter rather than a CAS.

Your fees can be paid directly from your own bank account to HRUC's account via bank transfer or in person via a relative (cash, credit/debit card, or cheque). All transfers must have an accompanying reference stating your name – this enables the College to issue the CAS more quickly.

Bank transfers should be made in pounds sterling using the account details on the offer letter. Please note that HRUC is not liable for any bank charges incurred through bank transfer – these will be deducted from the tuition fee deposit.



Visa Application Process

Once you have received your CAS, you can make an application for a Student Visa. Under the Immigration Rules, students making an application for a Student Visa are required to obtain 70 points.

POINTS	REQUIREMENT
50	Valid CAS reference number and qualification certificates as detailed on the CAS. (Students aged 16–18 will also have to show letters of consent from parents/guardians.)
10	Proof of maintenance – usually this will be a bank statement dated no more than 31 days before the date of application. You should ensure that this is from a UKVI recognised bank – details of these can be found on the UKVI website.
10	UKVI Secure English Language Test (SELT) result at a minimum CEFR B2 level, or proof you are from a majority native English-speaking country. If you are unsure please contact the HRUC International Office.

Evidence of Finances

The minimum amount of money required for a Student Visa application can be seen on the offer letter. Students will need to have paid their first-year tuition fee to HRUC and prove living costs. As HRUC is a London college group you will need to show funds as specified in the student visa rules, these change periodically, so please contact the International Office for the required amount that you will need to provide evidence for.

NHS Surcharge

Most international students will need to pay a health surcharge, which is £776 a year. The total surcharge amount will be payable upfront at the time of your visa application. Your payment will give you access to the National Health Service on the same basis as anybody who is ordinarily resident in the UK.

Visa Interview

As an international student you may be invited to attend an interview as part of your visa application. The interview will be carried out through video or in person at the Visa Application Centre. At the interview, an entry clearance officer may ask you about your English language ability, your immigration history, your education history, and your financial circumstances. If you are invited to an interview, be honest and research in advance so you are ready to answer their questions. We would particularly recommend you visit the College website and familiarise yourself with the College and the course you wish to study.

The Visa

Once you have submitted your application, you will receive one of two outcomes:

1) Visa Approved


This will give you the right to enter the UK and study. Once you have received your visa, it is essential to ensure that all the details on this visa are correct.

2) Visa Refused

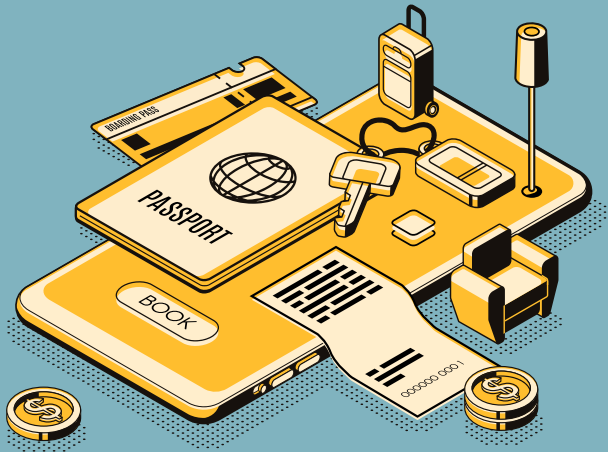
You will receive paperwork detailing the reasons for refusal. It is your responsibility to ensure that HRUC or your agent, if you have used one, receive a copy of this as soon as the outcome is known. Depending on the reason for refusal, you may submit a fresh application or apply for an administrative review. Please note that the options given to a student who has received a refusal are at the discretion of HRUC.



PRE-ARRIVAL ADVICE FOR STUDENTS



You may still have some questions about life in the UK. We advise you to attend our international student induction webinars once you have received an offer from HRUC. This will give you an opportunity to speak to our current international students and learn from their experiences.



Enrolling at HRUC

If your visa is approved, we request that you inform us as soon as you have made plans to travel so that we know when to expect you. If for any reason you are not able to travel and complete your enrolment, we need to be kept informed.

Once you have arrived in the UK, you will meet with the International Office and complete enrolment. You will need to bring your passport, original qualification certificates and payment for the charges applicable for course materials and exams – this will be specified in your offer letter.

e-Visa:

An e-Visa is an online record of your immigration status in the UK. Once you have received confirmation of your student visa, you will need to create a UKVI account to be able to apply for and access your e-Visa.

You can use an eVisa to travel to the UK together with your current passport, which must be linked to your UKVI account. You will also be able to receive and generate share codes to prove your immigration status to relevant third parties in the UK.

Please note that the UK Government's ID Check App will be needed for this process. (Please ensure that your mobile

phone device is updated to the latest operating system).

If you do not have access to the app on your device, please use a trusted persons phone.

Work Rights

Students at HRUC are given 10 hours work permission per week during term-time and may work full-time during College holiday periods.
